Funds are not used to support individual sport teams or clubs.

Painting – we have a mural that will installed late June. We are looking at painting some hallways to brighten up the school. The African Nova Scotian mural is almost complete. This mural was designed and painted by students with help from the Halifax Regionals Art teacher Ms. Jensen.
