The week came to a close on Friday with a BBQ, and the selling of the remainder bake sale goods. On Monday April 10, Dhaba Express kindly sold their delicious food, with all proceeds going to the Terry Fox Foundation. We are so grateful for their generosity. The 6 day event was a big success, with the funds that had already been raised earlier on this year by grocery bagging and bottle drives, we Warriors will contribute \$5,000 to the Terry Fox Foundation this year.
