

The Nova Scotia Homework Hub

The Nova Scotia Homework Hub to support students in grades 9,10, and 11 mathematics is now ready for use! Enclosed please find information cards to distribute to each student enrolled in a grade 9, 10 or 11 mathematics course and one poster per mathematics teacher. Additional posters can be displayed in a prominent location. E.g., Student Services, school office.

What is the Nova Scotia Homework Hub?

The Nova Scotia Homework Hub is an exciting online platform that offers resources and free tutoring for students enrolled in grade 9,10, or 11 mathematics courses. Students can have a 1:1 session with a tutor, in French or English, via an online whiteboard, or by calling in on the phone. Students can also access additional learning resources that include video lessons, practice exercises, quizzes with instant feedback, digital versions of the mathematics textbooks, where available, and a scientific and graphing calculator.

How do students and teachers access the Nova Scotia Homework Hub?

They can login to their gnspes account and click on the Homework Hub icon. Students and teachers of all Mathematics courses from grades 10-11 have Nova Scotia Homework Hub access at this time, and grade 9 students will have access beginning on November 14th.

What will teachers find on the Nova Scotia Homework Hub?

Teachers will find the same resources that students can see. They can suggest videos or exercises for additional student practice to support out of class study if they wish. What can a student expect from a tutoring session?

Students will have access to tutors from 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Sunday to Thursday. Each tutoring session is a maximum of 20 minutes, although this can be extended by the tutor as needed. All tutors are qualified Nova Scotia teachers or teachers in training. Students can use a textbox and audio with the tutor. There is no limit to the number of times a student can access a tutor. Tutors will not do homework for students, but will help to support them in their learning. Tutors are also able to clarify important concepts introduced in the classroom.
